

Principal's foreword

am pleased and honoured to introduce you to our special '50th' year of education at St Joseph's College Coalisland. St Joseph's College Coalisland is designated as a non-selective Catholic post-primary school catering for pupils of all abilities from the parishes of Ballyclog and Donaghenry, Clonoe and further afield. When the College first opened its doors on the 2nd of September 1968, the visionaries of the time could not have anticipated the changes that would take place worldwide. Our school name illustrates the transition through the eras: from 'the Intermediate' to the 'High School', to Mary Donnelly's reinvention of the 'College'. St Joseph's has adapted and changed to meet the requirements of the time whilst remaining a warm, safe-haven where the needs of the individual are paramount.

Over the last 50 years we have evolved and transformed our school to complement the diversity of our ever-changing society and we continue in our endeavours to embrace our duty as Coalisland's Community School. - Zambia Education Development Project St Joseph's has forged close links with St Paul's in Lusaka supporting this developing school through financial contribution, volunteering visits from the RE department, our school chaplain and past pupils and providing basic educational requirements.

Pastoral Care

The pastoral care and well-being of each and every child at our school is of paramount importance. Every member of staff shares responsibility for supporting our children in a safe and secure environment; one that is conducive to promoting self-esteem, building confidence and developing resilience in this ever changing, global society.

Our Pastoral Circle illustrates the structures embedded in our policies to support your child. Your child is supported by a team of experienced and caring professionals beginning with his/her form teacher who meets with him/her on a daily basis. The Year Head has the responsibility for supporting and encouraging the academic and pastoral development of all pupils within her year group. The Year Head plays a pivotal role in strengthening the relationships between home and school.

Our Senior Teacher Mr Mulholland, the Designated Child Protection Teacher, looks after the pastoral care and discipline within our school. Our Leader of Learning Support is responsible for special education needs and our Leader of Learning is in charge of academic and curriculum needs.

These structures in our school provide your child with numerous avenues through which to access support as required.

The Principal, Mr McNeill, leads us all in the pastoral care of our pupils.



Digital Technologies in St Joseph's College

In September 2014 St Joseph's College embarked on a journey into the twenty-first century: the 'iPad Initiative'. This venture had been researched and devised, with the support of Mr McNeill, by Mrs Ciara Donnelly and Mr Brendan McNally. Intensive training programmes and financial options were considered and with the dedication and enthusiasm of all staff the initiative was embraced.

Today we have every pupil in Years 8-11 enhancing their learning experiences through the use of iPads. Teaching has been upgraded to meet the ever changing needs and demands of new technologies in our rapidly evolving global community. Pupils are stimulated and learning continues very easily outside the classroom via connectivity and collaboration. None of this could have been achieved without the support of our parents, governors and staff.

Last year our college was awarded 'Beacon School' status through iTeach. We recruited a team of Digital Leaders (Key Stage 3 pupils) who guide and support both staff and pupils through any new developments. This year we deliver Computer Science as a discrete subject to all Key Stage 3 pupils. Mrs Kerr, recipient of the Silver Award from iTeach, has devised a programme that builds upon the digital skills of our pupils and prepares them for the world of work in later life.

Through the use of this technology our students gain the opportunity to develop sophisticated and important life skills. The familiarity students have with digital technologies allows for applied problem solving through logical, critical and creative thinking. Working as teams to solve challenges promotes resilience, teamwork, tolerance and communication skills.

Learning Centre

The Learning Centre has been an integral part of St Joseph's College for over twenty years. It clearly demonstrates commitment to meeting the needs of all statemented pupils placed in our care. An experienced team of teachers and classroom assistants support pupils in their emotional, social and cognitive development and to engage in the school curriculum at their own level and pace. It envelops their social needs within a positive structured setting which aims to enhance learning and life skills.

The Autism Centre caters for pupils with Autistic Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and Asperger's Syndrome. It offers the opportunity for these young people to access mainstream education while providing the support structure they require.

We at St Joseph's are proud of our inclusive ethos: our provision of a secure and safe environment for every child and our commitment to removing barriers to learning thereby supporting individuality and diversity.


